The **WIC Technical Assistance and Peer Coaching (TA-PC) Center**, led by the University of Minnesota's Center for Research and Outreach (REACH Lab), is developing a sustainable, replicable model to strengthen and support both the current and future WIC workforce. The Center integrates innovative stakeholder-driven, training and coaching practices to build capacity across the WIC system.

Our Vision

To cultivate a well-supported, modern WIC workforce of talented staff who are a part of and understand the communities they serve — leading to improved service delivery and staff retention across WIC programs nationwide.

Key Components of the TA-PC Center

Community-Centered Workforce Development

We're creating learning resources and tools that support WIC strategies for hiring, training, and retaining the WIC workforce. Rooted in community knowledge, these materials reflect the real-world experiences of WIC professionals and participants.

Innovative Coaching Model

State and Local agencies will be supported by trained coaches — WIC professionals embedded in the system — who deliver ongoing, personalized support. These coaches will engage in year-long professional development and collaborate directly with sites to strengthen skills to engage with families.

Centralized Training Support Hub

The TA-PC Center serves as a coordinating body for resource management, coach training, and program evaluation. A centralized digital platform will provide access to tools, training materials, and research-based guidance, enabling WIC agencies to adapt and thrive.

Goals & Outcomes

- Build a foundation of evidence-based learning opportunities.
- Develop a replicable coaching system to provide long-term, proactive training opportunities.
- Coordinate national-scale centralized evaluation, communication, and support systems.

Expected Impact

- Higher retention of WIC staff through improved support systems.
- Better nutrition and health outcomes for families.
- Scalable tools and models to support WIC programs nationwide.
